LO: To explore the work of Andy Warhol or Jean Michal Basquiat. Look at some of the work by Famous Artist. Get the children to describe what they can see and how it makes them feel. How do you think it was made. What do you think inspired Andy Warhol. Talk to the children about the life of famous artist. Talk about the type of art (Pop art/ graffiti if looking at Jean Michal Basquiat). Task: Have a range of Andy Warhol work for the children to pick from. Children to go and evaluate his work. Thinking about the materials used. How it makes them feel. How they think the artist was feeling. What they like/dislike. What is the message behind the	LO: To explore mono printing techniques used by artist. Children will focus on the skill of Mono printing. Look at example from famous artist Andy Warhol/Jean Michal Basquiat. Children to look at the skills of mono printing using layers of acetate or laminating film. Focus on building up layers, colour and texture to reproduce a famous piece. Using laminating pouch type plastic, cut out the shape which is needed. Place the shape over a piece of card and roll paint over. This will produce the shape and repeat the process.	LO: To design a final piece in the style of Revisit how to print on to card using a multiple of layers approach. Knowledge of the wider world: have a look at Brooklyn School of Art where JMB studies. What was his life like growing up? How did his culture influence his art?

A prominent theme in the early Basquiat portrayed historically prominent black figures, such as <u>Charlie Parker</u>, who were identified by Basquiat as black heroes and saints.

Basquiat's diverse cultural heritage was one of his many sources of inspiration. He often incorporated Spanish words into his artworks like <u>Untitled (Pollo Frito)</u> (1982) and <u>Sabado</u> <u>por la Noche</u> (1984).

Raising aspiration: Look at JMB early life Jean-Michel Basquiat was born in <u>Brooklyn</u>, New York, on December 22, 1960, shortly after the death of his older brother, Max. He was the second of four children of Matilde Basquiat (née Andrades) (July 28,1934 – November 17, 2008)^{III} and Gérard Basquiat (1930 – July 7, 2013).^{IZIIII} He had two younger sisters: Lisane, born in 1964, and Jeanine, born in 1967.^{IAIIII} His father, Gérard Basquiat, was born in <u>Port-au-Prince</u>, Haiti, and his mother, Matilde Basquiat, who was of Puerto Rican descent, was born in <u>Brooklyn</u>, New York.^{III} Matilde instilled a love for art in her young son by taking him to art museums in Manhattan and enrolling him as a junior member of the <u>Brooklyn</u> <u>Museum of Art</u>.^{IIIIII} Basquiat was a precocious child who learned how to read and write by the age of four and was a gifted artist.

How did JMB use art to show the contrasts of, for example, poverty and wealth? Integration and segregation.

Basquiat's art focused on dichotomies such as wealth versus poverty, integration versus segregation, and inner versus outer experience.
