"I liked going to Halton Library, there were so many books to choose from!" - Curtis, Y4

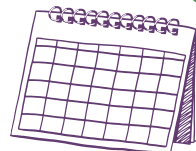
"I enjoyed reading about Amelia Earhart - I found out she was the first female to fly a plane." - Grace, Y3
