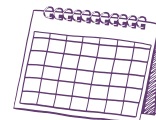
## Scholastic Book Fair

## Autumn 1 term Shine Experiences

### Year 3/4 One Day Creative Workshop

This term, Year 3/4 took part in an exciting workshop delivered by One Day Creative, who use the performing arts to empower young people. The children explored Living Things and Their Habitats, linking perfectly to our science topic this term, and also discovered the wonders of the Rainforest, which will be our geography focus next term. They were fully engaged throughout, showing great enthusiasm and curiosity. It was a fantastic day filled with creativity, teamwork, and lots of learning!



### Year 5/6 visit Safety Central

Y5/6 Attended a fantastic Safety Central event at a purpose built facility where they learnt all about staying safe. The children learnt about fire safety and saw how quickly a room could fill with fire and smoke; road safety including crossing train tracks; water safety and what to do if you or another person falls in; and online safety including online bullying. This trip was complemented by Halton Healthy School and NSPCC workshops where the children found out more about unhealthy food/smoking/vaping and alcohol. The children were able to contribute a lot during group discussions and took some valuable things away from each of these events.
