- Monday 15<sup>th</sup> June - Friday 19<sup>th</sup> June: Summer term assessment week.



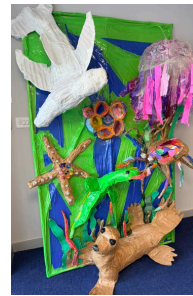
## Earth Week 2026!
